Section 1194.21 Software Applications and Operating Systems - Detail Voluntary Product Accessibility Template

Criteria	Supporting Features	Remarks and Explanations
(a) When software is designed to run on a system that has a keyboard, product functions shall be executable from a keyboard where the function itself or the result of performing a function can be discerned textually.	CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion with exceptions.	There were some cases in which the product functions and features were not accessible through the keyboard.
(b) Applications shall not disrupt or disable activated features of other products that are identified as accessibility features, where those features are developed and documented according to industry standards. Applications also shall not disrupt or disable activated features of any operating system that are identified as accessibility features where the application programming interface for those accessibility features has been documented by the manufacturer of the operating system and is available to the product developer.	CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.	Testing has indicated that the product does not disrupt the accessibility features of other products.
(c) A well-defined on-screen indication of the current focus shall be provided that moves among interactive interface elements as the input focus changes. The focus shall be programmatically exposed so that Assistive Technology can track focus and focus changes.	CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion with exceptions.	There were some cases where the products focus was not tracked by assistive technology.

<p>(d) Sufficient information about a user interface element including the identity, operation and state of the element shall be available to Assistive Technology. When an image represents a program element, the information conveyed by the image must also be available in text.</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion with exceptions.</p>	<p>Alt tags were not provided on all images such as the HTML Help system.</p>
<p>(e) When bitmap images are used to identify controls, status indicators, or other programmatic elements, the meaning assigned to those images shall be consistent throughout an application's performance.</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.</p>	<p>Bitmap images and actions associated with them are consistent.</p>
<p>(f) Textual information shall be provided through operating system functions for displaying text. The minimum information that shall be made available is text content, text input caret location, and text attributes.</p>	<p>This criterion does not apply to CaptureEze Pro.</p>	<p>A text window records the log of what is being done. Also the log file can be saved.</p>
<p>(g) Applications shall not override user selected contrast and color selections and other individual display attributes.</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.</p>	<p>The product does not override user-selected contrasts and color selections.</p>
<p>(h) When animation is displayed, the information shall be displayable in at least one non-animated presentation mode at the option of the user.</p>	<p>This criterion does not apply to CaptureEze Pro.</p>	<p>No animation is used in the product.</p>
<p>(i) Color coding shall not be used as the only means of conveying information, indicating an action, prompting a response, or distinguishing a visual element.</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.</p>	<p>The product does not use color coding as the only means of conveying information.</p>
<p>(j) When a product permits a user to adjust color and contrast settings, a variety of color selections capable of producing a range of contrast levels shall be provided.</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.</p>	<p>Were the user has the ability to adjust colors a variety of color selections a variety of color selections producing a range of contrast levels is provided.</p>
<p>(k) Software shall not use flashing or blinking text, objects, or other elements having a flash or blink</p>	<p>CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.</p>	<p>The product does not use flashing or blinking text or objects.</p>

(I) When electronic forms are used, the form shall allow people using Assistive Technology to access the information, field elements, and functionality required for completion and submission of the form, including all directions and cues.

(a) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user vision shall be provided, or support for Assistive Technology used by people who are blind or visually impaired shall be provided.	This criterion does not apply to CaptureEze Pro.	The product does not provide full accessibility for blind users using assistive technologies. Some menus and tool bars may not be readable.
(b) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require visual acuity greater than 20/70 shall be provided in audio and enlarged print output working together or independently, or support for Assistive Technology used by people who are visually impaired shall be provided.	This criterion does not apply to CaptureEze Pro.	The product does not provide full accessibility for visually impaired users using assistive technologies. Assistive technology such as a screen reader/magnifier does not read static text, field names, and contents of combo boxes.
(c) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user hearing shall be provided, or support for	CaptureEze Pro supports this criterion.	The product does not require user hearing to operate the product.

Assistive Technology used by people who are deaf or hard of hearing shall be provided

(d) Where audio information is important for the use of a product, at least one mode of operation and information retrieval shall be provided in an enhanced auditory fashion, or support for assistive hearing devices shall be provided.

This criterion does not apply to CaptureEze Pro.

No audio signal is generated by the software.

(e) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user speech shall be provided, or support for Assistive Technology used by people with disabilities shall be provided.

No speech input signal is required to operate the software.
